



Alice Peterson Detention Alternative Program

WHAT: The Alice Peterson Detention Alternative Program is a 24-hour therapeutic environment for adolescent males, ages 12-17, who experience emotional or interpersonal problems within their family or community and have exhibited behaviors leading to involvement in the Maricopa County Juvenile Court System. APR is licensed by the Department of Health Services as a Level III Group Home and accredited by the Joint Commission.

WHO: APR serves males, ages 12-17, referred through the Maricopa County Juvenile Court Centers.

WHEN: A New Leaf has been operating Residential Treatment Centers for adolescents since 1974. Alice Peterson Detention Alternative Program opened in 2006.

WHY: The goals are:

- To give a positive and therapeutic alternative to detention
- To increase self-sufficiency and family support
- To provide a safe environment for growth and change

HOW: The program provides:

- Care and supervision
- Individual and group therapy
- Case management and resourcing
- Family counseling
- Life skills development and education
