



West Valley Community Behavioral Health Services

WHAT: A community-based center in western Maricopa County providing confidential services for children, youth and their families. Counseling, case management, medication management and support services are provided for those eligible under the Magellan of Arizona contract. Staff members also facilitate and provide in-home family support services, the Parent and Children Teaming Together Program (PACTT) and the After School Program.

WHO: For individuals who are enrolled in the Magellan Behavioral Health System. WVCBHS provides Masters level therapists, Bachelors level family support specialists, Masters and Bachelors level interns and paraprofessional staff supervised by licensed professional staff. Medication services are provided by licensed medical providers.

AREAS OF FOCUS:

WVCBHS work with children and families with problems of abuse, neglect, and mental health. Issues addressed include post traumatic stress, adjustment issues, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, depression, domestic violence, obsessive compulsive disorder, anxiety disorders issues, relationship issues, sexual abuse and substance abuse issues. Staff specialties include crisis management, cognitive/behavioral therapy, mediation/conflict resolution, solution focused brief therapy, relationship enhancement and play therapy, attachment and self-regulation therapy, character-based social and living skills and substance abuse counseling.

WHEN: A New Leaf's West Valley Services, established in 1985, was originally West Side Social Services. Glendale hours are Monday-Thursday 8-8, Friday 8-5.

- to decrease involvement in the legal system
- to increase stable satisfying family relationships
- to provide access to human services and community resources.
