



## Domestic Violence Advocate Fact Sheet

**WHAT:** A Domestic Violence Court Advocate to provide services to all victims of abuse and violence.

Services include:

- Assistance with questions about protective orders and with filing protective orders
- Court Accompaniments for protective orders hearings and family court hearings
- Assistance with service of protective orders as needed
- Victims Rights information
- Provide community resources and referrals as appropriate
- Provide basic information on family court procedures
- Referral to legal assistance and advocacy

The court advocates at all 3 sites are bilingual in Spanish and English and can assist individuals in person or over the phone.

**WHO:** Anyone who is a victim of domestic violence or sexual assault in need of assistance
