



Mayfield Alternative Youth Center
and
JAG Youth Center
(Juvenile Alternatives in Glendale)

WHAT: A free community-based alternative to traditional juvenile court services for status offenders, pre-delinquent youth and their families. These Centers provide immediate crisis stabilization services to youth arrested for status offenses (i.e. runaway, curfew violation, truancy, or incorrigibility) and families in crisis. Walk-ins are also welcome.

WHO: The Centers provide no-cost intervention and referrals to youth and their families.

WHY: To provide an immediate intervention and resources to youth and their parents for easy access to culturally sensitive services. The Mayfield and JAG Youth Centers serve to connect the community with law enforcement, juvenile courts, collaborating agencies, and the school districts, in order to provide prevention and intervention services and support to families.

SERVICES: Immediate crisis stabilization • intake & assessment services • referrals • individual, family & group counseling • education groups • short-term (up to 23 hours), non-secure alternative to detention • crisis hotline & outreach • aftercare follow-up & services • evaluation & mediation services • school-based services

WHEN: Mayfield and JAG operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

HOW: A New Leaf serves as the lead agency in partnership with the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), The Governor's Office of Children, Youth and Families (OJJDP), Valley of the Sun United Way, Mesa United Way, the cities of Mesa and Glendale, and Magellan Arizona. The Center's staff provides intake assessment and time out for all interventions. Families receive referrals to collaborating agencies for counseling services.
