CAFA possesses a number of professional staff that assist with the most pressing challenges facing a survivor of domestic violence or sexual violence. Domestic Violence advocates help identify and address survivor's needs. Advocates work with individuals and families to set goals that are centered on a self-sufficient life.

Legal advocates help survivors navigate through orders of protection, divorce/custody/ child support, criminal cases, victim's rights and compensation, safety planning, and referrals.

An Empowerment Counselor provides one-on-one counseling sessions for survivors of domestic and sexual violence as they heal from the trauma they have experienced.
