A New Leaf's Desert Leaf Apartments offer a safe and supportive environment for veterans and individuals to recover from trauma and find long-term stability.

The apartments reside within a gated, close-knit complex in which on-site staff work closely with each resident to make sure they receive the support they need. The complex fosters a community rooted in a shared identity and provides services such as basic needs, counseling, and community resources. Active case management and comprehensive support services are also provided to residents to ensure stable housing.

Residents are survivors of homelessness, domestic violence, or severe mental illness and are referred through community partners and governmental entities. Over 50% of the units are occupied by veterans, and all residents fall below the federal poverty line.

Participation is voluntary and tailored to meet the individual's needs, assisting them in adapting to living with stability, autonomy, and dignity. While most meetings and activities will occur at Desert Leaf Apartments, residents will be assisted in obtaining needed services and support in the community.

Desert Leaf partnerships include: A New Leaf, Mercy Maricopa Integrated Care, MARC Community Resources and the Cities of Mesa and Phoenix.

Desert Leaf Apartments accepts homeless individuals and families. Units are first offered through the Family Housing Hub. If no families meet required criteria for placement, the property management company, Kay Kay Realty, will seek potential residents through other agencies, such as HUD-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing.
