A New Leaf's Family Connections program is a change-focused intervention that helps families to set and achieve goals that will facilitate healthier family dynamics.

Some families face hardships that can make it difficult to maintain healthy family dynamics in a household, and this can lead to involvement with the Arizona Department of Child Safety. Family Connections is a solution for these families.

Help begins when a Family Connections Consultant meets with the family in individualized sessions to best address each family member's needs based on their unique situations. This ensures that families receive the right services and support at the right time.



Family Connections gives you the support you need to build healthy relationships within your family.

The Family Connections Program also connects families to services so parents can meet the family's needs which can include; utility, rent or child care assistance, emergency food or clothing, household furniture and supplies, and connection to mental or behavioral health and substance use resources.

Family goals include: Social Support, Family Functioning, Family Resources, Child Well Being, Parenting Attitudes, and Managing Parenting Stress.
