Designed with all of the needs of a patient in mind, La Mesita Family Care is able to provide medical care, counseling, case management, medication management, and support services as needed. This integrated care approach allows an individual to obtain all of the care they need to address their challenges in one convenient location.

The outpatient clinic's services are provided by therapists, case managers, psychiatrists, nurse practitioners, a primary care practitioner, and other trained staff who are supervised by licensed professional staff. The outpatient clinic is able to provide services to enrolled patients from birth through 64 years of age.

Behavioral health issues addressed may include: attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, depression, anxiety disorders, adjustment disorders, relationship issues, substance abuse, and trauma-related issues, such as abuse, neglect, and domestic violence.
