

# empowering services

A New Leaf's Mesa Community Action Network (MesaCAN) helps low-income households across the City of Mesa with a host of services in one convenient location. With a wide variety of programs, MesaCAN's services include:



**Financial Coaching** offers qualified staff who will work with you to establish a budget, understand how to save, learn to pay off debt, and more.

**Rent and Utility Assistance** provides rental assistance to those facing eviction and utility assistance to households facing utility shut-off.

**SOAR Works SSI/SSDI Outreach, Access, and Recovery** helps those currently in A New Leaf's shelter programs apply for SSI and SSDI as needed.

**Basic Needs** including diaper distribution, food boxes, snack bags, and hygiene bags are also provided.



### **Employment Assistance**

**Workforce Services** helps all job seekers, including those recovering from a crisis situation, secure employment or create a plan for more stable employment.

**MesaCAN Economic Development Program** provides support for low and moderate income individuals by collaborating with local businesses and other institutions.





#### **Health Assistance**

**Women, Infants and Children (WIC)** provides families with nutrition information, healthy foods, breastfeeding support, referrals to healthcare, and more.

**Maricopa County Public Health Immunizations** operates onsite to provide children with free health services, promoting the overall health of the county.



### Household Resources

**Broadband Resources** are offered to households looking for affordable, reliable internet connection. The Arizona Commerce Authority created a listing of resources for the community to secure quality internet resources.

**Weatherization Assistance Program** reduces energy costs for low-income households by increasing energy efficiency. Services may include; air conditioning, insulation, and more.
