Parent Support Group

Monthly foster parent support group led by leading experts in behavioral health or experienced speakers on the topics at hand.

Therapeutic Foster Care

A therapeutic caregiver provides care to children that endure behavioral health issues. A child is matched up with an adult who is in the behavioral health field to house and guide them to stability.

Community Foster Care

A community foster care provider cares for children who have been placed in the system.

Kinship Licensing

A kinship foster caregiver is an adult or relative who cares for and shelters a foster child who has direct involvement with the Department of Child Safety (DCS).
