La Mesita also offers incredible access to community resources, on-site case management, workforce assistance, emergency basic needs items, and monthly basic life skills classes are offered free of charge. These resources, and other support services, help households find stability and move forward.

Some housing units serve households at or below the 60% median income. Some units serve households at or below the 30% median income. Units are available to assist those transitioning from homelessness, with preference given for veterans.
