## life-saving hotline support

**SAFEDVS hotline is a 24-hour domestic violence hotline providing assistance to survivors of abuse in Maricopa and Pinal Counties.**

When a survivor calls SAFEDVS hotline, a staff member will always be available to assist. Trained operators will immediately assess the level of danger in order to determine which resources would be the most helpful to the caller. Every caller is assisted according to their unique circumstances, no matter what they may be.

Some callers receive immediate police assistance, while others work with the operator to build a safe exit plan. Wherever a survivor is on their journey to finding safety, A New Leaf will be able to help them plan for the future. Operators help survivors access emergency shelter, basic needs, and other services, such as legal advocacy, referrals, employment assistance, and financial literacy classes.
