A New Leaf's VITA Program is a powerful anti-poverty tool, providing free tax preparation services ensuring that hard-working individuals receive the maximum tax benefits available without losing hundreds of dollars in paid tax preparation fees.

The program is administered by IRS-certified volunteers who provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals.

A New Leaf's VITA Program primarily serves low-to-moderate-income households, senior citizens, non-English speaking individuals, and individuals with disabilities. The VITA Program serves all ages, ethnicities, genders, and backgrounds.

The VITA Program provides services to thousands of people annually, saving low-to-moderate-income households hundreds of thousands of dollars in tax preparation fees. This ensures low-to-moderate-income households receive the maximum tax refund possible, while also keeping millions of tax dollars in local communities.

help with filing your taxes

A New Leaf recruits and trains approximately hundreds of volunteers each year to provide tax preparation services at convenient locations for low-to-moderate-income households to access services.

If inquired, households may be provided with referrals and access to additional support, including: budget coaching, financial literacy classes, employment services, health insurance enrollment, and asset development programs, which matches low-income individuals' savings for pursuing a post-secondary education.



The VITA Program is primarily active during the tax season, from January to April. Volunteers are recruited and trained to facilitate the VITA program from August to December.

A New Leaf's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program offers free tax assistance to households who make \$64,000 or less, focusing on persons with disabilities, the elderly, and limited English speaking taxpayers who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns.

A new Leaf's VITA programa es una herramienta poderosa contra la pobreza, proporciona servicios gratuitos de preparación de impuestos que garantizan a las personas trabajadoras el poder recibir los máximos beneficios fiscales disponibles sin perder cientos de dólares en tarifas de preparación de impuestos pagadas.

El programa es administrado por voluntarios certificados por el IRS que brindan servicios gratuitos de preparación de declaraciones de impuestos. Envío electrónico a personas calificadas.

A New Leaf's VITA programa principalmente sirve a hogares de bajos a moderados ingresos, personas mayores, personas con discapacidades que no hablan inglés. El programa atiende a todas las edades, etnicidad, géneros y antecedentes.

El Programa VITA proporciona servicios a miles de personas anualmente, ahorrando a hogares de bajos a moderados ingresos cientos de miles de dólares en tarifas de preparación de impuestos. Esto asegura que los hogares de bajos a moderados ingresos reciban el reembolso máximo posible, al mismo tiempo que se mantienen millones de dólares en impuestos en las comunidades locales.

Ayuda para Declarar tus Impuestos

A New Leaf recluta y entrena a cientos de voluntarios cada año para proporcionar servicios de preparación de impuestos en lugares convenientes para que los hogares de bajos y moderados ingresos accedan a los servicios.

Los hogares de bajos ingresos reciben referencias y acceso a apoyo adicional, incluyendo entrenamiento de presupuesto, clases de educación financiera, servicios de empleo, inscripción en seguros de salud y programas de desarrollo de activos, que coinciden con el ahorro de individuos de bajos ingresos para seguir una educación postsecundaria.
